

Lawyer to Ask Bail For Carter and Artis

PATERSON — Raymond A. Brown of Jersey City, attorney for Rubin "Hurricane" Carter and John Artis, charged with the slaying of three persons in a Paterson tavern last June 17, will argue that bail be set for his clients on Friday, Feb. 17.

Brown filed notice of his motion yesterday in the Passaic County Clerk's office.

Brown stated that the basis of his application is that there is "little likelihood" of a conviction for murder in the first degree.

Asks for Evidence

Brown will also ask that all evidence gathered by the state be submitted to him for examination.

Carter, 29, of 498 20th Ave., Paterson, and Artis, 21, of 5 Tyler St., also Paterson, are

charged with firing a shotgun and pistol into the barroom of the Lafayette Grill, 428 E. 18th St., Paterson, the morning of June 17.

Slain were the proprietor, John Oliver, 52, who lived in an apartment over the tavern; Fred Nauyoks, 60, a patron, of 89 Pompton Ave., Cedar Grove, and Mrs. Hazel Tanis, 51, a patron, of 176 Lafayette Ave., Hawthorne. Mrs. Tanis died of wounds two weeks after the shooting.

Another patron, William Marins, 42, of 225 Keen St., Paterson, recovered from his wounds but lost the sight of one eye.

Artis and Carter are charged with atrocious assault and battery and assault with intent to kill, in the wounding of Marins.
