

Two Men Sworn

Carter-Artis Jury Now Numbers Eight Members

PATERSON — Two men were chosen to sit on the first degree murder jury of Rubin (Hurricane) Carter and John Artis yesterday during the ninth day of jury selection.

Selection of jurors continued this morning before Superior Court Judge Samuel A. Lerner.

Sworn at 11:09 a.m. was Ronald J. Patierno, 31, of 259 Randolph Ave., Clifton, a consumer lending officer for the National Community Bank of Rutherford. He was the 10th person interviewed.

Ronald F. Luna, 28, a chemical salesman of 89 Cutler St., Clifton, was sworn at 5:14 p.m. Patierno was the seventh juror and Luna the eighth. Six more are needed before the trial testimony begins.

The state, represented by Assistant Prosecutor Vincent E. Hull Jr., is seeking the death penalty.

Carter, 30, of 498 20th Ave., and Artis, 22, of 55 Tyler St., both of Paterson, are accused of shooting four persons at the Lafayette Grill, 428 E. 18th St., Paterson, last June 17. Killed instantly were James Oliver, 52, bartender and part owner of the

avern who lived at the East 18th Street address, and Fred Nauyoks, 60, of 89 Pompton Ave., Cedar Grove.

Mrs. Hazel Tanis, 51, of 176

Lafayette Ave., Hawthorne, died three weeks later. The fourth victim, William Marins, 42, of 225 Keen St., recovered.

The state contends Carter, a former ranking middleweight boxer, and Artis, a former high school track star, walked into the bar about 2:30 a.m. and killed the three for no apparent reason.

Raymond A. Brown of Jersey City, representing Carter, and Arnold M. Stein of Denville, Artis' lawyer, contend the pair did not do the shooting and were nowhere near when the murders occurred.

Yesterday a total of 30 persons was interviewed as potential jurors. Brown exercised his sixth peremptory challenge. The remaining prospective jurors were excused by the court.

Thus far, since the trial began on April 17, a total of 209 persons have been interviewed. The state has used two of its 12 challenges, Brown six and Stein five. The remainder have been excused by the court.

Police Still Seek Missing Essex Girls

Fairfield, Roseland Teens Last Seen At Amusement Park

FAIRFIELD — Police have been tracking leads as to the whereabouts of two 13-year-old girls, one of whom is from this community who disappeared last Friday from Pallsades Amusement Park, Cliffside Park. So far nothing has developed.

Wendy Drobik, 2 Big Piece Road, Fairfield, and Rachel Green of Roseland, have been missing since then. They reportedly had money in
